RECIPE CORNER: INDIAN CUCUMBER SALAD

"Cool as a cucumber" is more than a catchy phrase to impress the ladies; the interior of a cucumber can be as much as 5 degrees cooler than the exterior. Try keeping your cool with this tasty Indian Cucumber Salad for four.

- 2 cups of diced cucumbers
- 2 green chili peppers
- 1/2 teaspoon of tamarind pulp
- 1/2 cup grated coconut
- 1/2 teaspoon roasted mustard seeds
- 2 tablespoons of cilantro leaves, chopped
- 2 tablespoons of salt
- 2 tablespoons of brown sugar (keep it minimal)
- 6 curry leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon olive oil

- 2 dried red chili peppers
- 1/2 teaspoon of black mustard seeds

1. Grind the green peppers, tamarind, grated coconut, roasted mustard seeds and cilantro together with salt and sugar in a little water.
2. Heat oil and when hot add the curry leaves, mustard seeds, and the red chili and heat till the mustard seeds splutter and the red chili turns aromatic.
3. Mix the ground paste with the cucumber pieces and pour the tempering over.
4. Serve immediately or risk Vishnu's wrath.



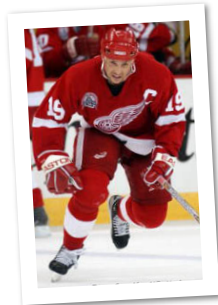

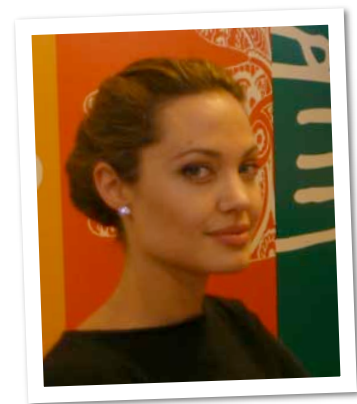
Dear Pedro, every girl wants to feel special. Perhaps for an upcoming event – a birthday, Simcoe Day, etc. – you could

Song Pick: *Miracle Drug* by A.C. Newman

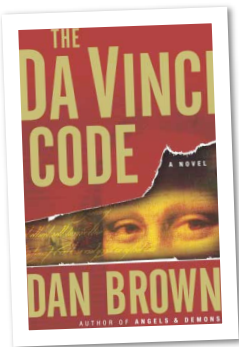
